Every generation needs to experience pentecost for itself. It needs God's spirit and it needs it in its own particular way.

Scripture assures us that the holy spirit is not a generic force, one-size-fits-all, but a person, a relationship, a spirit that has "particular manifestations" and gives itself to each of us uniquely so that the understanding and strength that we receive are geared to help us in our own particular struggles.

Where in life today do we most need the holy spirit to transform us? What are our peculiar spiritual disabilities?

We struggle today with individualism, and the problem is not just with the obvious, the breakdown of families, parishes, and communities. We need a Pentecost that can help us cope with the ideologies and

fundamentalism (social and ecclesial). We are forever infected with ideologies, be they of the left or the right, that block us from living vital parts of the gospel.

The deeper struggle is "the harshness of love." What is hard is the painful give-and-take of ordinary community, the habitual slights and hurts that arise in every marriage, family, community, parish, and civil life. We can't interrelate without hurting each other. So, we withdraw because we haven't the resiliency needed to deal with the bruises and disappointments.

What Pentecost needs to pour into us today is the spirit of resiliency, the spirit of forgiveness, the spirit of patience, the spirit of long-suffering, and the spirit of understanding.
